Joseph Faust Alaimo

Joe, was born in Geneva, New York, to Josephine and Faust Alaimo in May of 1948. His relatives are dispersed around Geneva, NY, and Chicago, IL. Joe attended the Rochester Institute of Technology, graduating with a BFA in Communication Design. He married young, started his work in advertising in New York, and eventually moved to San Francisco. He became a print producer and estimator at Alcorn & Strain, which marked the beginning of a long and successful career. He was Vice President of Print Production at Alaska Group, then at Mon-New, and since 2001 he was employed by Haggis Marketing, Inc. as Vice President of Print Production. Joe was an expert at his craft.

And Joe was always on the go. He excelled at sales, radio and press coverage. He became an

advocate for his clients, a partner to his workers, and a member to all who worked with him. He embraced the country freely in the performance of his print management responsibilities. His life was enriched by his love for the arts. His schedule doesn't fall as he attended concerts, lectures, author events and theater pieces. He loved movies and is rumored to own a DVD of every rear film ever made. He was an avid museum goer. The arts were his passion and, whether at home in San Francisco or traveling for work, he used every opportunity to indulge his insatiable curiosity.

Joe loved people and could talk to anybody. He did give the best receptionist, the Starbucks barista, the next door neighbor, a soon-to-be-stranger in the next seat on the plane. He remembered everyone's birthday, and everyone got a card with a sweet note from Joe. His generosity spread to friends and people on the street.

He is survived by his sister-in-law Anne Alaimo, his nephew Steve Alaimo, his niece Lynn Blanton, his friends Gale Peck, Maria Hicks, Carol Walsh, Rusty Hendley, Christine Horn, George Ryan and many others including a majority of his co-workers at Haggis Marketing, his peers at printing presses all over the country, his travel agents, his clients, the old business associates he'd kept in touch with through the years, the flight attendants, and the hundreds of friends that he'd made through the generosity of his spirit and his kindness. Joe was an irreplaceable treasure. He left the world November 18, 2009.

Che Jeremy Barnes

Jan. 27, 1974 - Oct. 26, 2009

Lieutenant Commander Che Jeremy Barnes, 35, was killed in the line of duty on Thursday, October 24, 2009 shortly after 7:10 PM. Che was the pilot in command of a Coast Guard C-130 that was on a search and rescue mission off the coast of San Diego. His airplane and six crew members were struck mid-air by a Marine Corps Super Cobra helicopter flying a night

training mission.

Che grew up on a small organic farm in Santa Covely's Capay Valley, California. He graduated from Esparto High School in 1990 and entered the United States Coast Guard Academy in New London, Connecticut. Che graduated with honors in Mechanical Engineering and during his 13 year military career, Che flew most aircraft in the Coast Guard, including three years flying the Coast Guard's fastest boat from Puerto Rico, five years flying the Coast Guard's first DeLiplan Rescue Helicopter from San Francisco and two years flying the Coast Guard's C-130 Hercules in Sacramento. Che taught the likes of many through his service with the Coast Guard and was decorated with many medals and honors including the Eber F. Stone Award in early October 2006 for demonstrating exceptional performance in Coast Guard search and rescue operations in a food wing aircraft.

Che was decorated with aviation at an early age and as a boy avidly built and flew radio controlled airplanes and later worked his way through flight lessons to solo a single engine plane on his 10th birthday. When not flying for the Coast Guard, Che flew his P40 bi-plane in aerobatic patterns. In addition to flying, Che also enjoyed playing his guitar, singing, photography, writing, reading and was pursuing an MBA. Che was also an advisor and partner to his family's farming company and retail store in the SF Ferry Building, familyofche@gmail.com.

Che joined his late mother, Catherine Barzotti in the afterlife and is survived by his father, Martin Barnes, his twin brother Noah Barnes, his two younger brothers, Thaddeus and Freeman Barzotti and his girlfriend of three years, Carrie Reynolds. Che will be sorely missed by his dear family and friends. Full military honor services will be held on Friday, November 20th 1:00PM at San Francisco's Presidio National Cemetery.
